The **finance report** for February was tabled, as Val Heide was unable to be present and there were some questions about this statement.

Vestry reviewed and discussed a **proposed new agreement for building rentals** developed by Therasa Hunt. It was very good discussion and will be refined in the coming months.

The wardens are working with Brian Crow to search out funding for replacement of the dishwasher in the lower level.

The **Mapping exercise** on March 9 was an excellent event and it has been suggested that another one be held for the wider community.

Welcome to our **new Office Administrator**! Jenny Davis will be working 10.5 hours per week. Her office hours are Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday 10 am to 1:30 pm.

The **Young Adult Games Night** in March, held at a local microbrewery, was very successful. This will be a monthly gathering with the ELCIC.

Plans for a **Confirmation service on June 16**, which Bishop Geoff will attend, have been confirmed (tiny bit of Anglican humor).

Pub Night fundraiser for Refugee Ministry on Saturday, May 4 - Doors open at 7 pm and the show starts at 7:30. Bishop Geoff's band Narwaltz (featuring Val's husband Paul) will be the entertainment. Tickets are \$20 per person. Drinks are \$5 with pop, coffee, and tea free. Contact Carey Isaac, Ben Girgis or Taps Maswera for tickets.

Information on **offering envelope usage** in the parish is being compiled and will be ready by May and then presented to the congregation.

From our **Easter Offering**, \$550 will go to KAIROS – a Canadian ecumenical program - for its Women of Courage initiative which helps people in Colombia, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, South Sudan, and the West Bank with counselling, legal support, training and accompaniment. The remainder of the offering will support the work of our parish.

Educational opportunities: Bible Study will resume in May (exact date to be announced) on Saturday mornings 10-11:30. Establishing a book club that would meet monthly is also being considered.

Discussion about plans to address our **parish future** took place. It was a good discussion and will be revisited going forward.

Say Yes to The Kids Sunday is an Anglican Foundation initiative to support children and youth. We will celebrate this on June 2.

We are pleased to host an information session from the Alzheimer Society of Manitoba on May 8 at 7 pm.

The presenter will review what it means to be dementia friendly, and offer simple and cost-effective suggestions for a business, organization or community group to ensure it is dementia-friendly, so that people living with dementia and their care partners can thrive in their community for as long as it is safe to do so.
