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Vestry Notes from November 28

Financially, the parish has had a good year, but with our deficit budget we need about an extra month's offering to ensure our books balance at the end 2023. That being said, the end-of-year generosity of parishioners has already begun! Many thanks to those of you who are offering extra if possible. With parishioners' generosity we will finish the year to the good...

One-third of our **Thanksgiving Offering**, \$550, was sent to the PWRDF Grow Hope project, which will allow farmers in Manitoba to plant crops that benefit the Foodgrains Bank.

Our October 26 event **"Where do we come from?"** was thoroughly enjoyed by all! So we will do it again on Sunday, January 21 with 3 speakers from our parish and a potluck lunch after service.

The presentation from Rev. Susan Smandych about **PWRDF** was also a great learning opportunity. We are looking into doing the mapping exercise in March 2024. Watch for more information.

The updated **church photo directory** is getting closer – we hope to see it soon.


Poinsettias have been ordered and will be picked up December 20 to display in the church; parishioners are free to take theirs home after the Christmas services.

Vestry decided that one third of the **Christmas Offering** will be sent to **Fearless R2W**. This local group helps people who have aged out of the Child and Family Services system (generally once they turn 18). "R2W" refers to the postal code of an area in the North End where in 2014 – when the group began – 1 in 6 households were involved in the foster care system. That year 365 babies were apprehended at birth in that postal code area. Our parish support will help Fearless R2W provide a way forward through housing for families reuniting, and advocacy and proactive support in job training for young people.

Turtle Island, Nogojiwanong, and Land Acknowledgements

You likely have heard many references to the names **"Turtle Island"** and **"Nogojiwanong."**

Turtle Island refers to the continent of North America. It is the name used mainly by the Algonquian and Iroquoian speaking peoples of northeastern North America. The name comes from various Indigenous oral histories of the original inhabitants of this region that tell stories of a turtle that holds the world on its back. The turtle is considered an icon or representation of life itself. [Learn more.](#)
